Catalina HomeGrown
Free Quilt Pattern

72" X 96" finished quilt top

Supplies:

Fabric A 1/2 yard (blue print)
Fabric B 3 yards (solid white)
Fabric C 2 1/4 yards (bright blue)
Fabric D 1 1/2 yards (solid red)
Fabric E 3/4 yard (binding) (blue print)
Backing fabric 6 yards
Batting of your choice (approx size 75" X 100")

12-1/2 " square ruler
Rotary cutter and cutting mat
6" X 24" ruler
Scissors and thread

Cutting Directions:

Fabric A: Cut 3 strips 5" X WOF
Cut 24 5" squares of the 3 strips
Cut squares in 1/2 diagonally for a total of 48 triangles. These triangles are now Triangle B

Fabric B: Cut 16 strips 3-3/8" X WOF
Cut 48 12-1/2" X 3-3/8" rectangles of the 16 strips and set strips aside. These are now Rectangle A.
Cut 4 strips 13-1/4" X WOF
Cut 12 13-1/4" squares from those 4 strips

Fabric C: Cut 24 strips 3-3/8" X WOF
Cut 48 18-1/4" X 3-3/8" rectangles from those 24 strips. These are now Rectangle B.

Fabric D: Cut 4 strips 13-1/4" X WOF
Cut 12 13-1/4" squares from those 4 strips

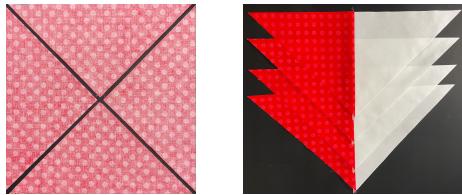
Fabric E: Cut 9 strips 2-1/2" X WOF and set aside for binding

Sewing Directions:

Step 1

Take Fabric B and Fabric D 12 squares and pair them with right sides together. Cut each square set in quarters diagonally for a total of 48 triangle sets.

Next sew scant 1/4" seam on one side of each of those sets making sure to always sew the same side of each set, pressing seam allowance toward the darker fabric. There will be 48 larger triangles now. These will be now know as Triangle A



Step 2

Place Fabric C rectangle right side up and lay Triangle A with right side down along the length of the Rectangle B, being careful not to stretch the Triangle A length. Pin carefully and sew scant 1/4" seam. Press seam allowance toward Rectangle B.



Step 3

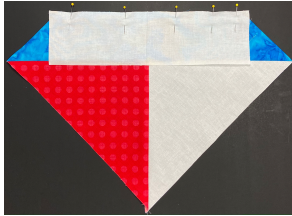
Using the 12-1/2" square ruler, square Rectangle B ends.



Step 4

Place Rectangle A on top of the Rectangle B overlapping the ends and right sides together.

Pin carefully and sew scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press seam allowance toward Rectangle A.



Step 5

Using the 12-1/2" square ruler, square the Rectangle A ends.



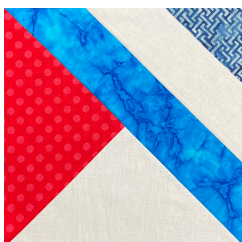
Step 6

Place Triangle B centered over Rectangle A length right sides together. Pin carefully and sew scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press seam allowance toward Triangle B.



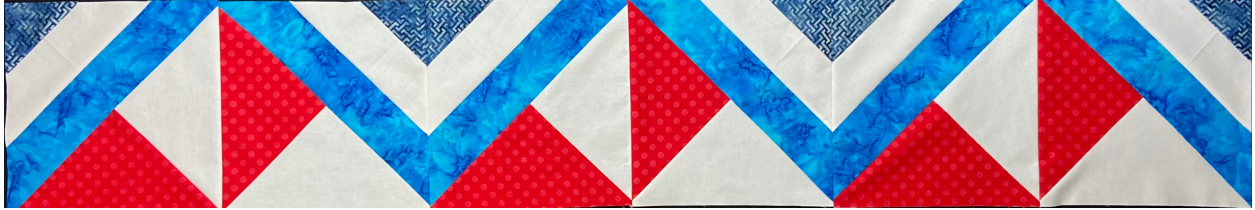
Step 7

Using the 12-1/2" square ruler, square the Triangle B which will complete the 12-1/2" square block for a total of 48 squares.



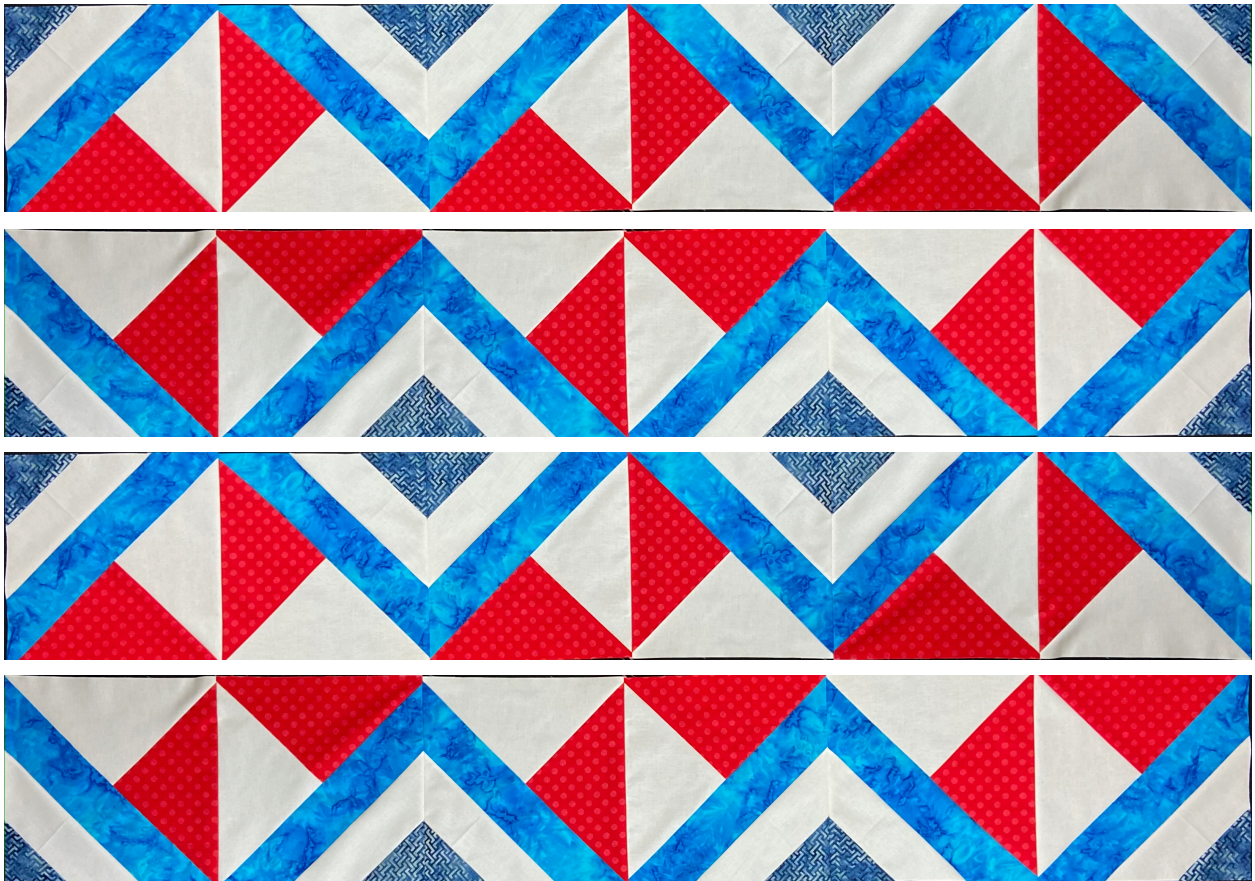
Step 8

Layout blocks 6/row following the picture. Pin blocks right sides together and sew with a 1/4" seam allowance. Press all seams open. You will make 8 identical rows.



Step 9

Layout each row, rotating the even rows to form the quilt pattern. Pin rows together carefully matching seams and sew with a 1/4" seam allowance. Press all row seams open.

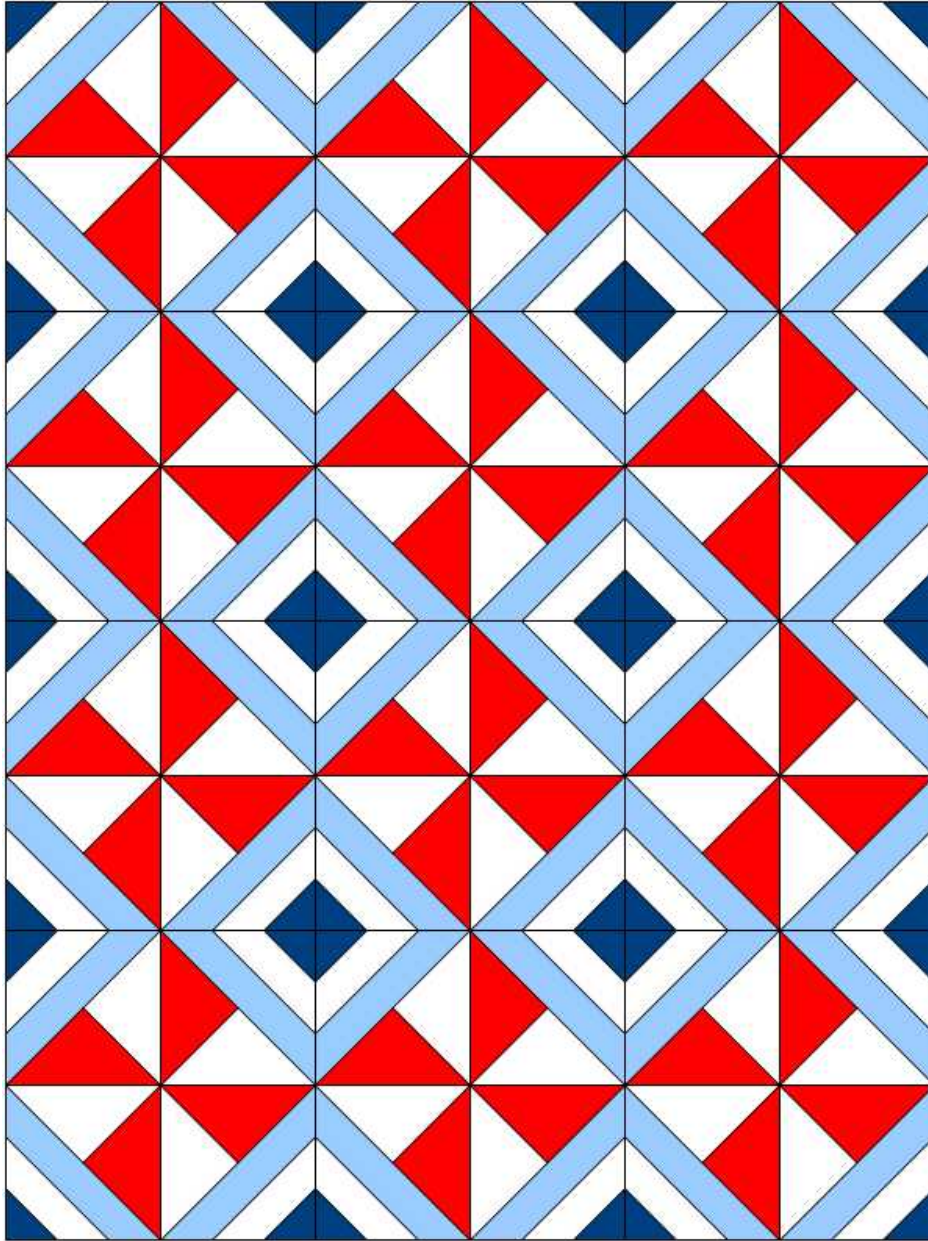


Continue laying out each row until all 8 have been used.

Finishing:

Prepare backing fabric, batting and press quilt top well before quilting.

Rotary cut Fabric E into 2-1/2" X WOF strips, sewing into 1 long strip. Fold in half lengthwise wrong sides together and press well. Sew to the finished quilted top to the front of the quilt and either machine sew or hand sew the binding to the back of the quilt
